**NOTICE OF MAKING OF AN ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2017
FOOTPATH 69 NAZEING**

Footpath 69 Nazeing

The above order, made on 24 February 2017, under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will divert as shown on the Order Map a part length of Footpath 69 of unknown width shown by a bold continuous line on the Order Map commencing from a point approximately 48 metres along the driveway to Stoneshot Farm from its junction with Hoe Lane running in a mainly north, north east and then north easterly direction through Stoneshot Farm and then along a field edge path for a total distance of approximately 223 metres to reach the location where a culvert crosses the headland where it continues unaffected, to an alternative route 2 meters in width shown by a bold broken line on the Order Map commencing at the aforementioned point along the driveway to Stoneshot Farm heading in a generally easterly direction within the boundaries of Stoneshot Farm for a distance of approximately 146 metres to a point in the south east corner where it continues within the boundaries of Stoneshot Farm in a northerly direction for approximately 146 metres to where it crosses the field boundary via a gap continuing in a easterly direction for approximately 10 metres to cross the field boundary and a stream via an existing culvert in a north westerly direction for approximately 7 metres to where it continues unaffected.

A copy of the Orders and the Order maps have been placed and may be seen free of charge at Chelmsford Public Library, Market Road CM1 1QH during normal working hours. Copies are available on request from the Chelmsford Library at a charge.

Any representations about or objections to the order may be sent in writing to Robert Lee, Definitive Map Service, Essex County Council, Seax House, 2nd Floor, Victoria Road South, Chelmsford CM1 1QH no later than 04 May 2017. Please state the grounds on which they are made.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, Essex County Council may confirm the Order as an unopposed order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations or objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent together with the Order. Any such representation or objections will be taken into account by the Council with the result that they may be made available to the public under the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985.
